Custodial history: The collection was assembled over time in Special Collections that had been largely amassed between 1988 and 1992. The collection was formally created in the late 1990s, most likely in 1998.

Conservation notes: All items placed into acid-free folders and archival boxes. Metal fasteners removed. Some clippings have been copied onto acid free paper, chiefly those in box 3.

Scope and Content: The dated material covers the 1880s-2009 with the bulk of the material ranging from 1910-1984. The collection is organized into six subseries, the bulk of which consists of ephemera and publications that epitomize the legacy and history of the Globe-Democrat.

The Globe-Democrat, formed by a merger on May 8, 1875 between The Missouri Democrat and The Globe, began publication in 1875. The Globe-Democrat was sold to Newhouse Newspapers in 1955 and then sold again to Jeffrey Gluck in 1984. Gluck filed for bankruptcy in August of 1985, which ceased the newspaper's publication. In early 1986, investors John Prentis III and William E. Franke made an effort to resurrect the paper, but their efforts failed during the fall of 1986.

On December 8, 2009, an online newspaper under the St. Louis Globe-Democrat name was launched. The online edition ceased on January 23, 2011.
