Scope and Content: The *St. Louis Republic* was printed from 1888 to 1919. Previous to being known as the Republic, it was the *Missouri Gazette* (1808-1820 and the *Missouri Republican* (1820-1888). The dated material covers the years 1900-1918, with the bulk of the material ranging from 1907-1918. Most of the collection is made up of the *Sunday Magazine of the St. Louis Republic*.
