Scope and Content: The collection contains twenty (20) original artworks by *St. Louis* 

Star editorial cartoonist Harry J. Tuthill (1886-1957). Tuthill was a nationally renowned cartoonist best known for the *The Bungle Family* comic strip which ran from 1924 to 1945. The comic first appeared in 1918 and was originally titled *Home, Sweet Home*.

Tuthill got his start as a political cartoonist at the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* during World War I. During this time at the *Post*, he was required to go to art school three days a week at Washington University. Later, he transferred to the *St. Louis Star* and did a strip titled *Lafe* about a lazy handyman. During his time at the *Star*, he produced topical cartoons and comics. In October 1919, Tuthill left the *Star* to become a newspaper cartoonist in New York. Sometime

in the mid-1920s, he returned to St. Louis where he lived until his

death at the age of 71.

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by the Post-Dispatch.

Remarks: Find the man who used to own the car is created to Archibald

Chapin in Digital St. Louis. It is a Tuthill cartoon.
